Call for Submissions

The Co-Editors of *Rehabilitation Education*, the flagship journal of the National Council on Rehabilitation Education (NCRE), and the NCRE Executive Board, are disseminating this *Call for Submissions* for a *Special Issue* of the journal on the topic of *International Rehabilitation Education*. Dr. Nan Zhang Hampton and Dr. Caren Sax, both of San Diego State University, will serve as *Guest Editors* of the *Special Issue*. The special issue on *International Rehabilitation Education* will be published as Volume 21, Number 4 (December, 2007) of the journal.

The purpose of this special issue is to develop a comprehensive overview of international rehabilitation counseling practice and personnel training and to provide rehabilitation educators with information and strategies for training their students to be competent service providers to multicultural populations in a global environment. The special issue will be divided according to the following geographical areas: Africa, Asia, Australia, Europe, North America, and South America.

Rehabilitation educators from the aforementioned regions are strongly encouraged to submit manuscripts as an individual author or as co-authors. American rehabilitation educators are encouraged to collaborate with rehabilitation educators outside of the U.S. to submit co-authored manuscripts.

Each manuscript should be approximately 15 double-spaced, typed pages in length (excluding references, tables, and figures). A standard format will be used to offer a cohesive overview of rehabilitation services and personnel training in different parts of the world. As such, each manuscript should include:

- Current status of rehabilitation/disability-related legislation, policies, and services for people with disabilities in the country/region.
- Description of rehabilitation personnel training (i.e., length of training, curricula, degrees granted, certification and licensure, and program accreditation in the country/region).
- Case study example of specific training program aspects (e.g., specific course, field experience).
- Implications for rehabilitation counselor education in the U.S.

All manuscripts submitted for consideration for publication in the special issue will be processed through full *Rehabilitation Education* manuscript peer review procedures. Manuscripts are required to be submitted per the *Guidelines for Authors* that appear in each issue of the journal and which can be found at the following web address: http://education.osu.edu/rehabed/Guidelines-for-authors.pdf
